The Financial Aid Office will review, and when appropriate, adjust a student's institutional, state and federal aid when a student, spouse, or parent has demonstrated a decrease in income for 2021 or 2022. We reserve the right to delay review, until the end of the calendar year, any appeal where reasonable projections cannot be made. Incomplete forms or missing documentation will not be processed.

- ❖ **Projected income (2022) will only be accepted from July 1, 2022-November 30, 2022.**
- ❖ **Income documentation must reflect Year to Date income from January 1st 2022 to date appeal submitted.**
- ❖ **Please allow 3-4 weeks for processing. *Incomplete forms will not be processed.***

REASONS TO APPEAL:

Circumstances that can be considered for appeal:

- Unemployment or change in employment
- Unusual medical or dental expenses
- Excessive debt related to business or unemployment
- Non-recurring income
- Birth, death, separation, divorce, or disability
- Loss of income due to natural disaster

Circumstances which will not be consider for appeal:

- Car payments or car insurance
- Consumer debt (credit cards)
- Mortgages and rent
- "Parents will not help pay for college"
- Home equity loans

Independent Students: *You must provide information for yourself and your spouse (if married).*

Dependent Students: *You must provide information for yourself and your parent(s).*
